# C. A summary of the report of abuse or neglect and a factual description of the contents of the report:

North Las Vegas Police Department was called to a residence on a report of a child drowning.

The Mandated Reporter advised the child was under the care of a licensed home-based day care facility. It was reported that the day care is located in a room in the back of the residence. One of the operators of the day care noticed two children were no longer in the residence and went to look for them. The day care operator went to the back door that leads to the backyard of the home and saw an iron gate that leads to the pool was open and one of the children was splashing around in the Jacuzzi. The day care operator ran to get the child and saw the second child floating face down in the bottom of the Jacuzzi. Upon screaming for help, the day care operator received assistance from others at the residence.

AMR responded to the scene and transported the two children to the hospital. The child that had been found floating face down in the bottom of the Jacuzzi was pronounced deceased by a hospital physician. The parents of the child were notified.

A representative of the State of Nevada Bureau of Services for Child Care contacted DFS and advised they are conducting an investigation.

DFS has been advised that, on 1/14/2009, a DCFS Child Care Surveyor conducted a visit at the day care facility and suspended the license.

- **F.** The cause of the fatality or near fatality, if such information has been determined: Preliminary information received reports the cause of death as drowning.

There was one previous report received by this agency with regard to this child. A requisite investigation was completed and the report was found to be unsubstantiated.
