



# CLARK COUNTY VOTER PROFILE

**“The current economic downturn has resulted in a net negative population growth, the extent of which is difficult to precisely measure.”**

**T**he first quarter of 2009 witnessed a 6.0-percent decline in the number of active registered voters compared to the prior quarter. This trend is neither unusual nor unexpected; voter registration typically slows in quarters following a general election. In fact, the number of new voters registered during the quarter totaled nearly 5,000 individuals, an 84-percent decline from the preceding quarter. During each quarter in 2005 (following George W. Bush’s re-election), the number of new voters averaged 5,800, and in no quarter exceeded 7,000 individual registrations.

That said, an overall decline in the number of active registered voters is unprecedented as Clark County’s two-decade long tenure as the fastest-growing metropolitan area in the country has more than compensated for the transient nature of its population. The current economic downturn has resulted in a net negative population growth, the extent of which is difficult to precisely measure. While a cursory review of the data potentially suggests that Clark County may have lost 50,000 active voters, it is worth noting that a change of address within the valley can trigger a move from the ‘active’ database to the ‘inactive’ database. Coupled with the extent of Las Vegas’ housing market crisis, it is no surprise that current quarter numbers shifted so dramatically.

While new voter registration activity during the quarter was not significant, an interesting trend in party affiliation did emerge. Almost 45 percent of new voters registered with the Democratic Party, compared to 52.7 percent of all new voters during the fourth quarter of 2008. Republican Party new voter registration increased 5.4 percent from quarter-to-quarter, capturing 24.0 percent of all new registrants. Whether or not this will develop into a long-term trend is unknown. Due to the small number of new voter registrations during the quarter, this may be an anomaly, the impact of which is largely immaterial.

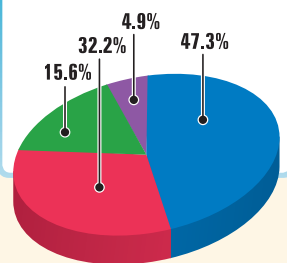
Despite the decline in total active voters, the overall makeup of active voters remains relatively unchanged from recent quarters. As of March 31, 2009, the valley was comprised of 374,581 (47.3 percent) active registered Democrats, 255,186 (32.2 percent) active registered Republicans, and 123,588 (15.6 percent) active registered Non-Partisan voters. The balance of the total 792,123 active registered voters, 38,768 (4.9 percent) active registered voters, was registered to other parties. Other parties consist of the Libertarian Party, the Independent American Party (the Nevada affiliate of the national Constitution Party), and the Green Party.

**W**e expect the volume of new voter registrations to remain low during the year, underscoring the difference between a presidential and municipal election, as well as decreased population in-migration. With several local city council and mayoral seats up for grabs during the second quarter, it is possible that voter registration activity will increase in response.

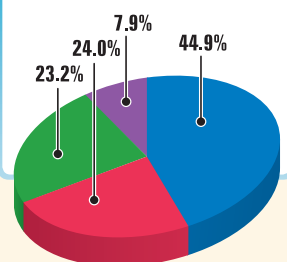

Registered Voters

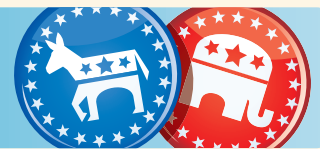

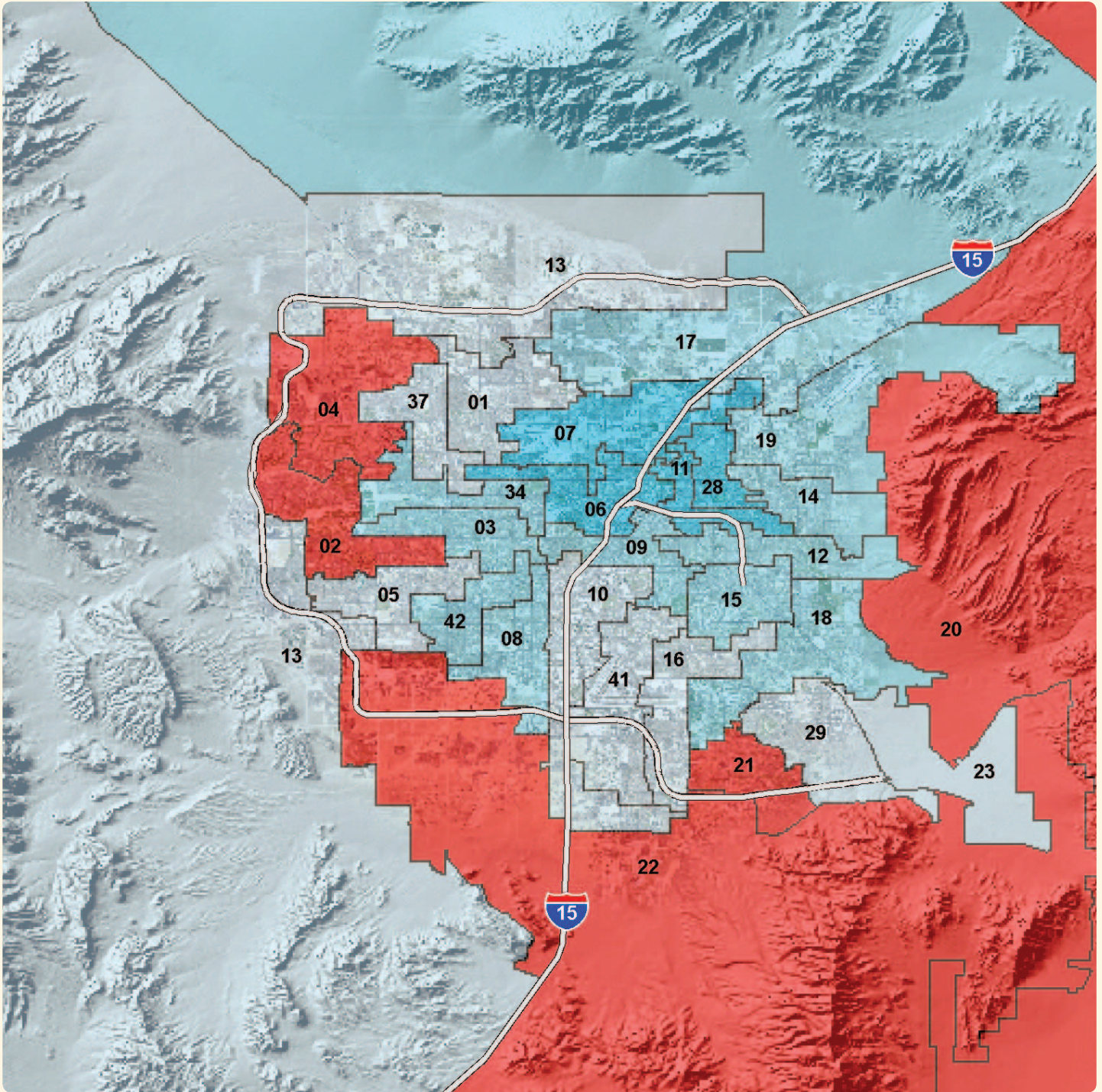


**PERCENT DEMOCRAT**

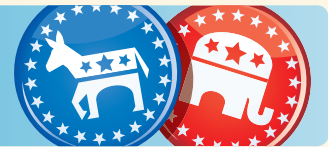


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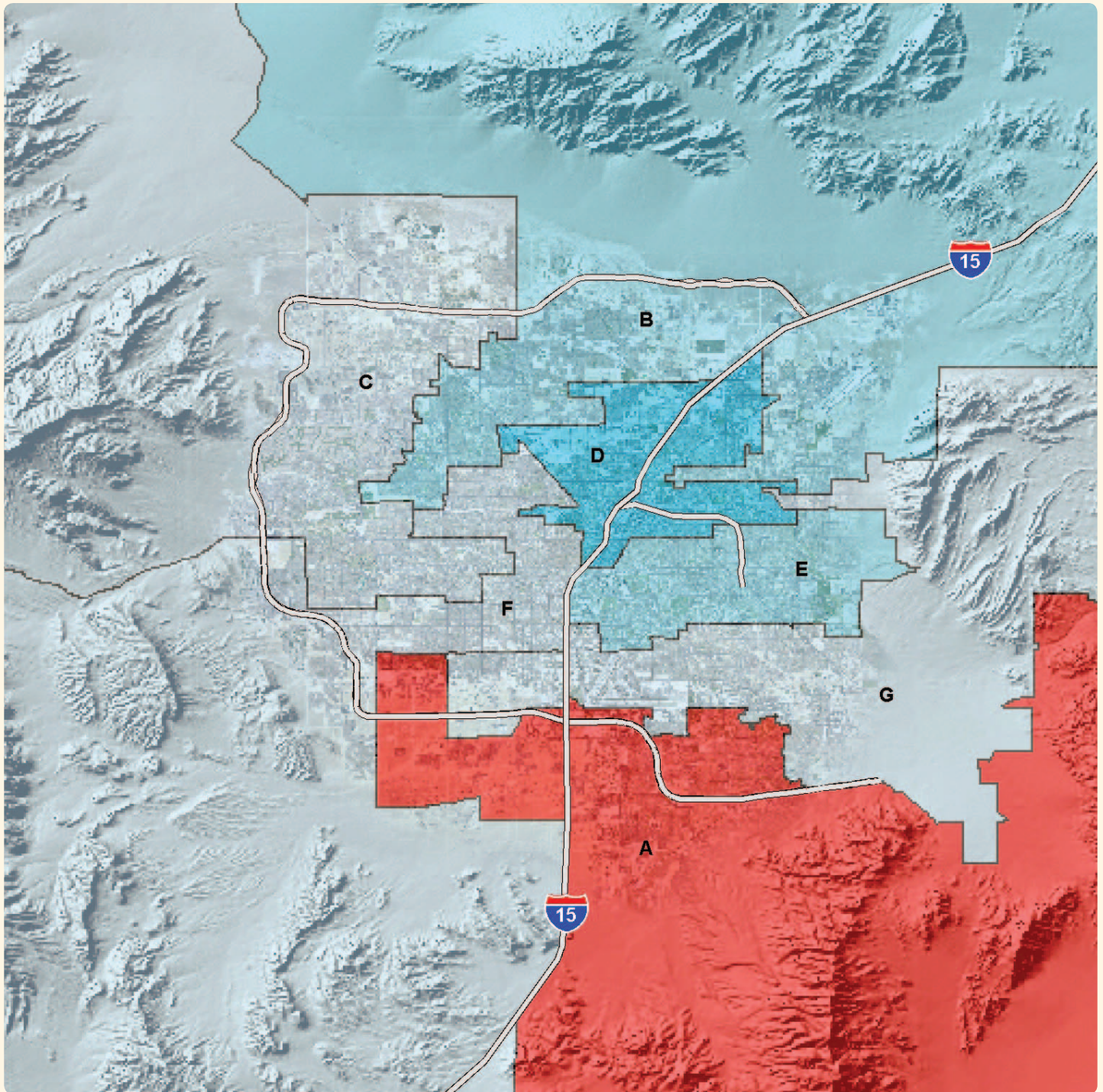


**PERCENT DEMOCRAT**

- 60% and Over

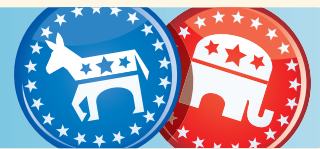

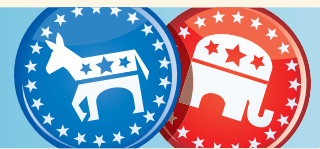

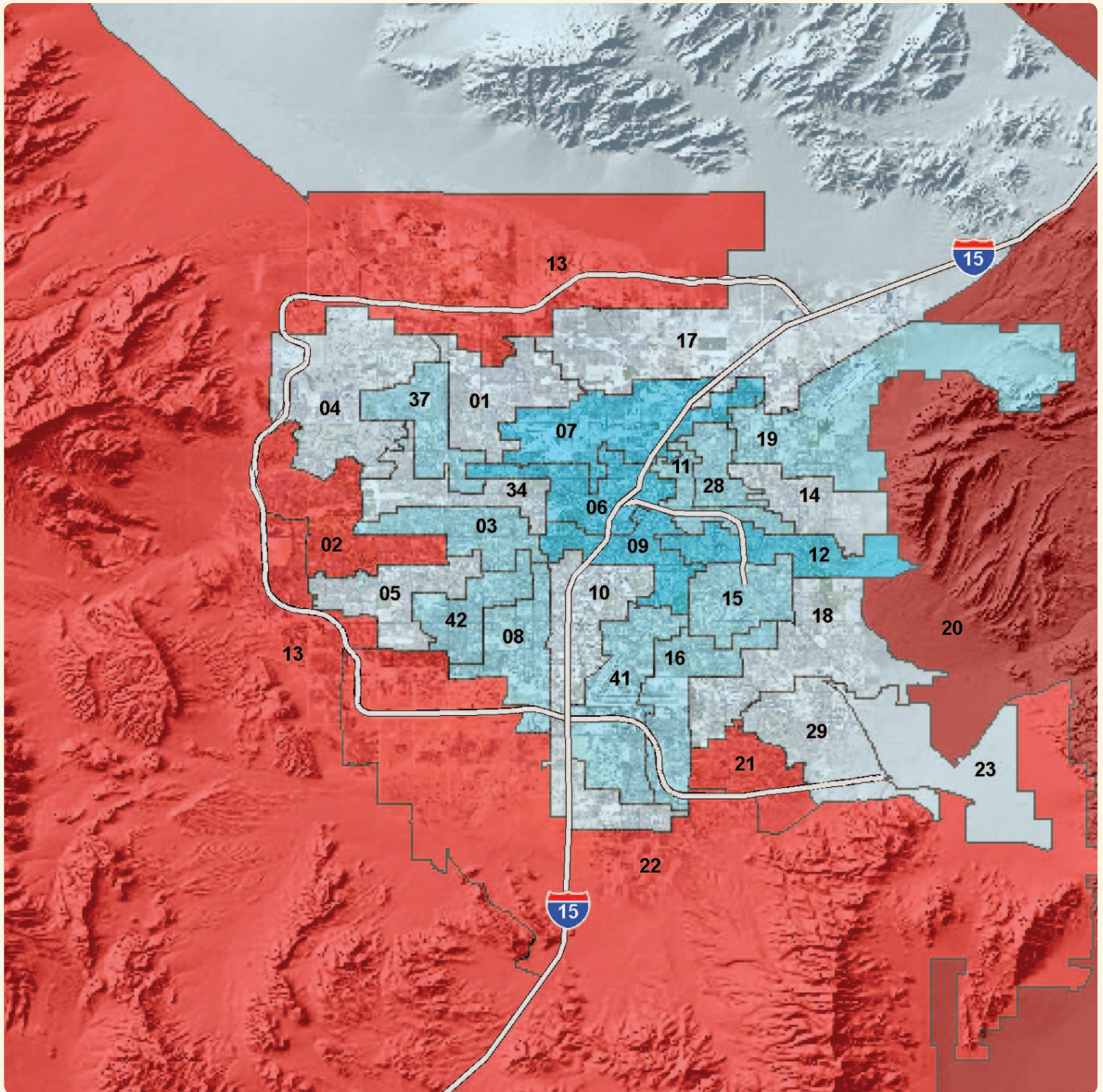


**PERCENT DEMOCRAT**

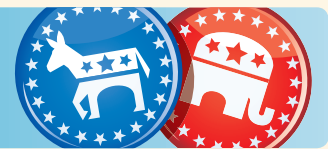

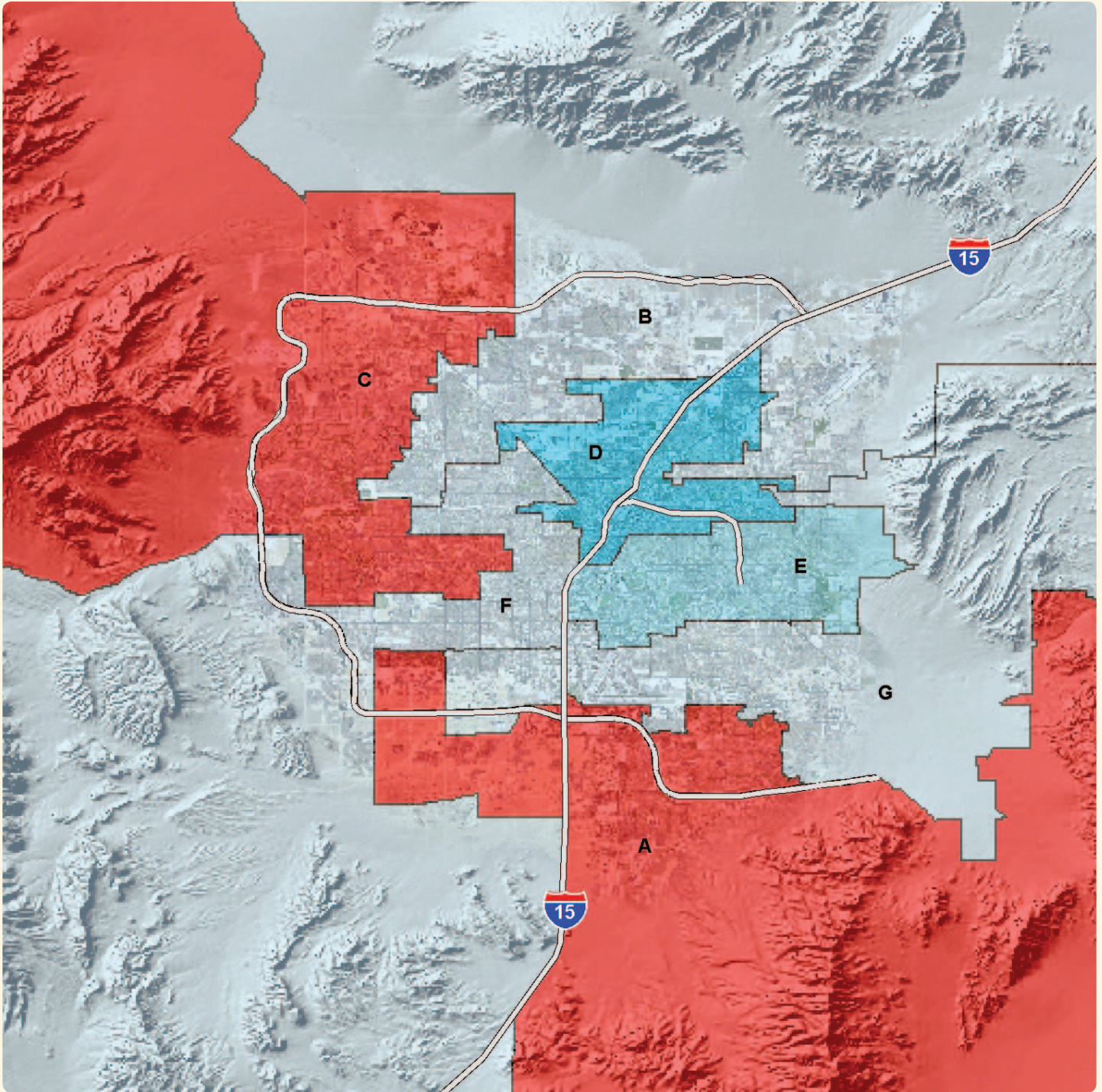


**PERCENT DEMOCRAT**

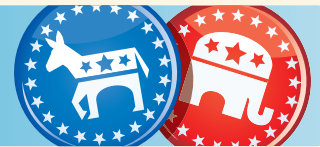

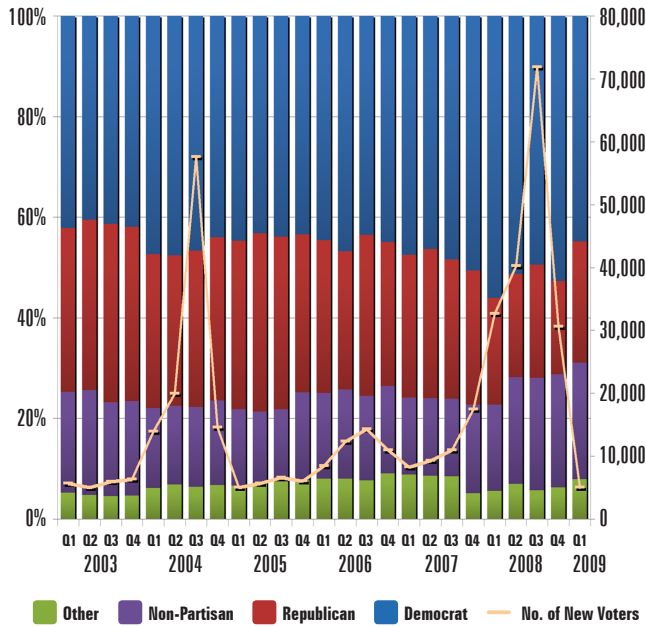

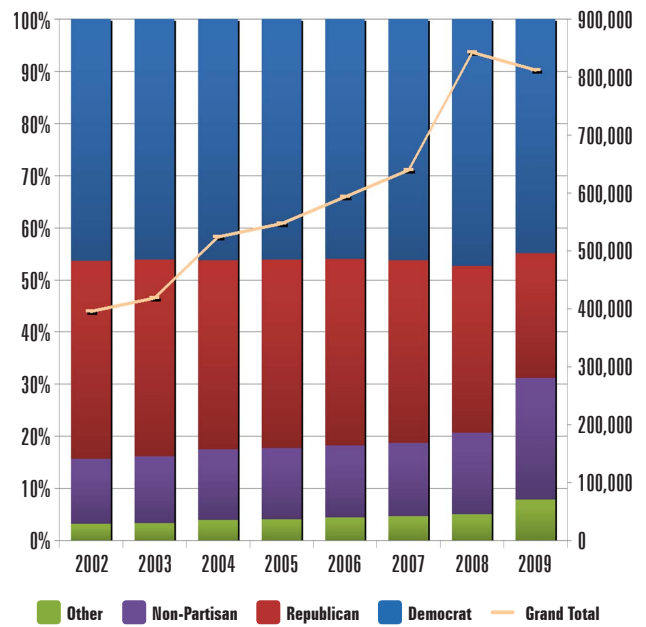

Clark County Quarterly New Voter Registration Profile



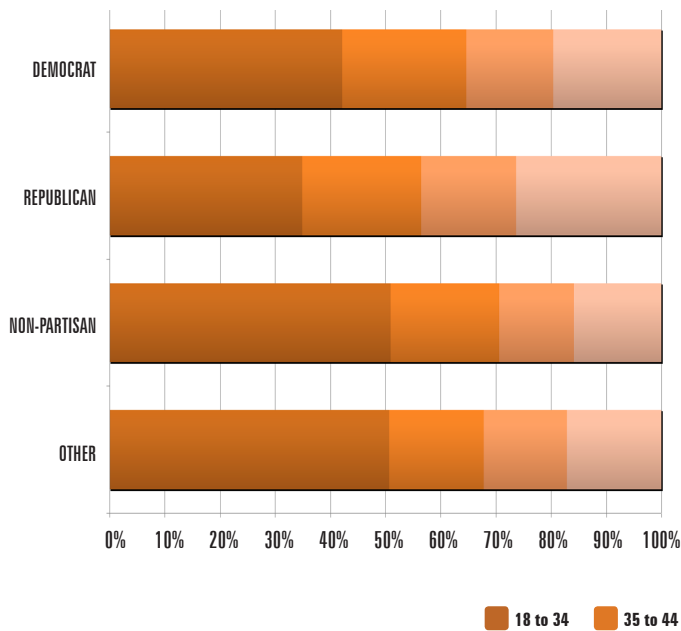
Clark County Annual Active Voter Profile



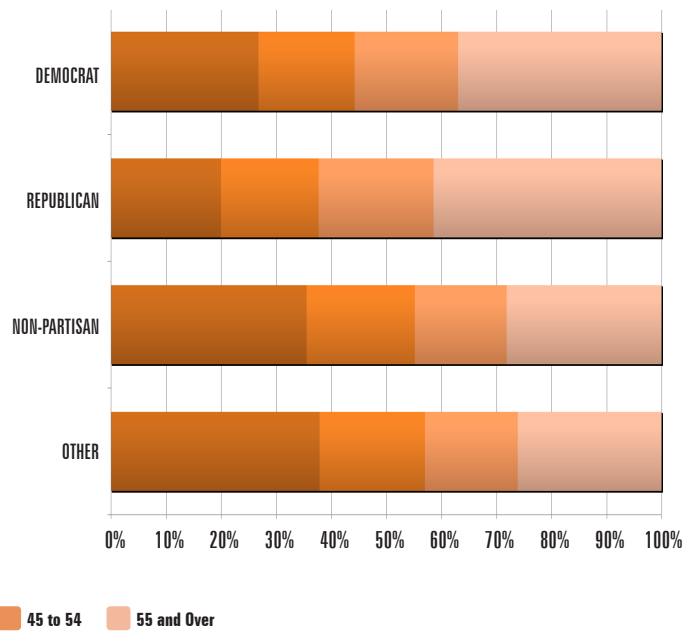
