## **NOTES & HIGHLIGHTS:**

Visitation increased (+0.7%) in March as Las Vegas hosted more than 3.2 million visitors during the month. March marks the seventh straight month of visitor volume matching or exceeding prior year levels.

Overall convention attendance was up 5.2% for the month, supported in part by a few larger shows (i.e. International CTIA WIRELESS 2010) occurring in March this year vs. April last year. This is the first year-over-year monthly increase in convention attendance in 2010.

While the transportation figures are not solely tourism-driven (as they include a mix of visitors and residents as well as commercial traffic and/or pass-thru travelers), the decrease in air passengers (-4.0%) compared to the increase in average daily auto counts (+6.1%) indicate a larger proportion of visitors are coming from drive markets.
