I want to make my position clear to the citizens of Las Vegas;

If it's one firefighter or one hundred, past or present, those employees that cheat the system should be terminated and prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

During last year's contract negotiations and subsequent arbitration hearing with the firefighters, we identified a pattern of sick leave abuse among certain employees. *I joined Commissioner Sisolak in requesting the Metropolitan Police Department, along with other law enforcement agencies, investigate this apparent fraud.*

THAT INVESTIGATION IS WELL UNDERWAY!

Throughout my public service, I have fought for "fiscal accountability" in managing public taxpayer dollars. That's why the Las Vegas Review Journal wrote; **Larry Brown "has been a dedicated watchdog of the City's budgeting process, helping save taxpayers millions of dollars."** (Nov. 2008)

At Clark County, this fiscal oversight has continued. Last year, we reduced the budget by 10%, representing over \$120 million in cost savings. In addition, 11% of county positions have been eliminated and a hiring freeze has led to a vacancy rate of 16.8% (1500 positions).

By shrinking the bureaucracy and focusing on service to our citizens, we begin to restore the Public Trust.

LAS VEGAS SUN Commissioner says any firefighter who abused sick leave should be fired

An investigation into sick leave abuse by Clark County firefighters continues, county commissioners were told Tuesday, but it may be a while before anyone is disciplined as a result.

"If it's one firefighter or if it's 51 firefighters, if they have committed fraud, if they have cheated the taxpayer, then we will go after them, terminate or prosecute to the fullest extent of the law,"

Commissioner Larry Brown said. "I don't think that can be lost because if nothing else, it has to set the standard and set the precedent that that behavior will not be tolerated."
